**ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 14.1.1 OF THE  
CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council are the governing authority of the City of Roswell, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined it is in the best interest of the public to appoint members of Boards and Commissions for only a limited number of terms:

NOW, THEREFORE, to accomplish the foregoing the Mayor and Council pursuant to their authority adopt the following ordinance:

1.

Section 14.1.1 of the City of Roswell Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by striking in its entirety the current subsection (a) and substituting a new subsection (a) to read as follows:

- (a) Each member of the Recreation Commission shall reside in the City of Roswell at the time of appointment and at all times during which such person serves on the commission. However, if a serving member moves outside the City limits, such member may serve until his/her successor has been duly appointed, or for a maximum period of six (6) months, whichever is shorter.

2.

Section 14.1.1 of the City of Roswell Code of Ordinances is further amended to add the following new subsection (c):

- (c) A member of the recreation commission shall not serve more than two (2) full consecutive terms after adoption of this ordinance, but may, at the election of Mayor & Council, be appointed to serve on another Board or Commission. If members of the recreation commission are currently serving an unexpired term, said term shall not be considered an initial term for purposes of these term limits. A position on the recreation commission currently being occupied by a holdover member shall either be filled by reappointment, with such reappointment being deemed an initial term for purposes of term limits, be filled by a newly appointed member or be deemed vacant six (6) months after adoption of this ordinance. A member whose term expires after adoption of this ordinance may serve until his/her successor has been duly appointed or for a maximum period of six (6) months, whichever is shorter.

3.

*Severability.* Should any section of this Ordinance be declared invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof which is not specifically declared to be invalid or unconstitutional.

*Repeal of Conflicting Provisions.* All ordinances, parts of ordinances, or regulations in conflict herewith are repealed.



*Renumbering.* It is the intention of the Mayor and Council, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances, City of Roswell, Georgia and the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.



This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its adoption the public welfare demanding it.


