Discussion of amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement regarding Roswell/Alpharetta Public Safety Training Center - Guidance

The Committee discussed the amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement noting that effective July 1, 2011, the Roswell Public Safety usage will be 47% and the Alpharetta Public Safety usage will be 53% of the operational costs. This was an informational item - no action was required.

4. Discussion of Preliminary Cost Estimates for Fire Station 4 at two site options - Guidance

The Committee requested that a list of all available properties in the area, consisting of 1.5 acres with explanations as to why they were not brought forwarded for consideration, be provided by-e-mail for review.
