**RESOLUTION TO SUBMIT A
FY2013 PROJECT LIFESAVER GRANT PROPOSAL**

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of Roswell, Georgia, held on the 24th of September 2012, a motion was made and duly seconded that the City of Roswell, Georgia agrees to submit a grant proposal for consideration by Project Lifesaver International; and


WHEREAS, the Department of Justice has awarded federal funding to Project Lifesaver International to assist qualifying agencies with initiating the Missing Alzheimer's Disease Patient Assistance Program in their communities. The Project Lifesaver project is a public safety program designed to protect and locate missing persons with Alzheimer's disease, dementia and other cognitive conditions due to wandering. The City of Roswell is seeking on-site instruction for law enforcement, instructor training and equipment (2 receivers, 2 transmitters, extra batteries, wandering kits, and shipping) valued at approximately \$4,000; and

WHEREAS, if the grant is selected for an award, Roswell will pay a one-time \$450 training fee and cover the Project Lifesaver International instructor's travel costs. The Roswell Police Department will be responsible for the implementation, management, reporting and close-out of the grant project; and

WHEREAS, the City is not required to provide local matching funds from the Grant Match Fund Contingency:


