WHEREAS: The City of Roswell regards the public safety of our driving teenagers

and adults as a chief concern; and

WHEREAS: Virtually every adult and many driving teenagers in Roswell and

across Georgia rely on wireless service to keep in contact with family and

friends; and

WHEREAS: Since the first text message was sent 21 years ago, text messaging has

become the preferred method of communications for many, especially

teens who send on average 60 texts per day; and

WHEREAS: Ninety-eight percent of American commuters know sending a text or

email while driving is not safe, but statistics show that nearly 50 percent

of commuters text while behind the wheel; and

WHEREAS: A Virginia Tech study showed those who send text messages while

driving are 23 times more likely to cause an accident involving fatalities

or grievous injury; and

WHEREAS: A driver that sends a text message while driving not only jeopardizes

his or her safety, but also the safety of other innocent passengers,

pedestrians, and other drivers; and

WHEREAS: Through ItCan Wait.com, Facebook, Text-to-Pledge, Tweet-to-Pledge,

Rotarians Against Distracted Driving (RADD) and events sponsored in communities, more than two million people have committed to never text

and drive; and

WHEREAS: On September 26, 2014, AT&T and the Rotary Club of Roswell join

with the students, parents, teachers, and administrators of Centennial High School and the Roswell community to take the *It Can Wait and RADD Pledges* and to share their commitment with family, friends and others to

encourage awareness of no texting and driving.
