RESOLUTION SEEKING APPROVAL TO SUBMIT A 2010 SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL – INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT GRANT SEEKING \$500,000 IN FEDERAL FUNDS

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of Roswell, Georgia, held on the 22nd day of November, 2010, a motion was made and duly seconded that the City of Roswell, Georgia agrees to submit a 2010 Safe Routes to School (SRTS) – Infrastructure Project grant application in partnership with Fulton County Schools for consideration by the Georgia Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the proposed SRTS grant application for a combined Mimosa Elementary School and Mountain Park Elementary School project shall seek a maximum of \$500,000 in Federal funds for eligible infrastructure improvement expenses; and

WHEREAS, the City is not required to provide local matching funds, SRTS is a 100% federal-aid program. Local funds and in-kind donations are not required or accepted. The Georgia Department of Transportation and its agent, Kimley-Horn, will oversee the project's design, scope/bid, implementation, administration and close-out; and

WHEREAS, the City, if the grant application is selected for an award, would be responsible for the regular maintenance of the infrastructure and facilities constructed by the Georgia Department of Transportation:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City that the Mayor of Roswell and/or the City Administrator is authorized to execute the grant application and any subsequent documents necessary to provide the grant funds, if any, to the City of Roswell, this the 22nd day of November, 2010.
